CABINETRY MEASURING GUIDE

How to Measure

- Sketch Room Shape.** Start with the overall room shape (square, rectangle) and draw in all the appropriate obstacles such as doors, windows, or structural elements that will not be moved.
- Measure.** Working out from the corner, work one wall at a time. Most people find it easiest to start with the longest measurement on the wall, notate it, and then measure the distance from the corner to the obstruction such as a window, notate it, and then measure the obstruction and mark that down.
- Rounding.** Although, we want the measurements to be as accurate as possible - rounding up to the nearest quarter inch is acceptable. We can double check prior to the final order.
- Layout.** Mark the location (or desired location if moving) of your kitchen components, such as the sink, oven and or cooktop, refrigerator, and any other significant appliances.
- Ceiling height.** Don't forget to include the height of your ceiling with your measurements. This is critical in determining what size upper cabinets will be best for your space.
- Take pictures!** They help us get a better feel for your space and identify any potential mismeasurements.
